Here are the instructions for those interested in editing, updating and perhaps improving the open source applications.

Part I To retrieve source code for SMSDeviceManager

(This is the application that runs on the phone which is used to see data FROM the Raspberry PI)

1) Review tutorial published here:

2)) Start Android Studio

3) Click "Check out project from Version Control"

4) Select 'git'

5) For device repository enter:

`https://github.com/optimizedsms/SMSDeviceManager.git`

6) Hit clone

7) Enter your github credentials.

8) Open the project

9) wait for Gradle Sync to complete.

10) You can now, edit, build and run.

Part II. To retrieve source code for the SMSGateway

(This is the application that runs on the phone connected to the Raspberry PI)

2)) Start Android Studio

3) Click "Check out project from Version Control"

4) Select 'git'

5) For device repository enter:

`https://github.com/optimizedsms/SMSGateway.git`

6) Hit clone

8) Open the project

9) wait for Gradle Sync to complete.

10) You can now, edit, build and run the gateway application.
